## Disclosing Innovation Information/OIPC

Our university researchers, students and staff are innately innovative. There are always solutions being created to problems that arise, especially when dealing with novel research or Alaska's unique work environment. Those innovations are often valuable, not only because they solve an immediate problem, but they could change the way others do research by incorporating

(e.g., a grant, contract or cooperative agreement) can retain title to inventions or technology if certain disclosure obligations are met.

OK, then, what should be disclosed? Any invention or technology conceived or brought to physical fruition with the assistance of the federal funding (whether or not a patent was applied for by the university or company) is subject to the Bayh -Dole Act and should be disclosed.
