Courses with this attribute address Alaskan and circumpolar issues as a substantial component of the course and have at least 50% of the readings and assignments of the course devoted to topics relating to Alaska and the circumpolar North.

**(D) attribute courses** will place social justice in historical and political context; enable students to articulate insights into their own cultural rules and biases; demonstrate a complex understanding of the complexity of the history, values, politics, beliefs, and practices of other cultures; interpret intercultural experiences from more than one worldview; and articulate a complex understanding of cultural differences in verbal and non-verbal communication.
